**Everything You Need to Know But Were Afraid to Ask!**

**Missouri Valley Morgan Horse Club, Inc. is not responsible for accidents or injuries. Participants agree to take part at their own risk and must sign a waiver before participating. In case of medical emergency, call 911. Ord Animal Clinic can be reached at 308-728-5221 or 7731.**

**Show Format & Eligibility** • The show is open to any registered Morgan horse or horse with one registered Morgan parent. Youth exhibitors who are MVMHC Youth Club members may show other breeds. This is a schooling/clinic/practice event to provide experience for other shows and to learn riding and showing skills. The judge may comment before, during, or after a class if he or she wishes. Exhibitors may ask questions.

**Showing Attire** • Formal show ring attire is not required, but you are encouraged to dress safely and neatly and to use tack appropriate to the class. Appropriate attire would include jeans or breeches, a long- or short-sleeved collared shirt, boots, and a hat or helmet.

**Health Requirements** • This event does not mandate health certificates for equine entries; however, each horse must be capable of passing a veterinary health exam and must be in appropriate physical condition to perform in any classes entered. At the discretion of show management, any horse in questionable health or physical condition may be required to submit to a veterinary exam at the expense of the owner/exhibitor and/or may be prohibited from showing.

**Entry Fees and Prizes** • An office fee of \$5 per rider/number will be collected at registration. The cost to enter one class is \$5, or enter as many classes as you wish by paying \$20 per adult for one day or \$30 for both days. Youth may participate at \$5 per class, or half price rates of \$10 per day or \$15 for both days. Ribbons will be awarded to six places and special prizes will be awarded to participants in classes for youth 6 & under.

**Stall Fees** • Loup Valley Ag Society requires payment of \$25 per stall, payable when you arrive. Shavings will not be available at the Fairgrounds, so please haul your own or purchase them from the Spaulding Co-op (528 N. 14<sup>th</sup>) or Orscheln's on Highway 11. As soon as possible, please reserve your stalls and request tack stalls by contacting Jennifer Rawlinson at [jcrawlson@windstream.net](mailto:jcrawlson@windstream.net) or 402-560-3319. Showing from a trailer is permissible but overnights will require a stall.

**Classes** • On the day of the show, classes may be changed to reflect interest. Classes may be canceled if there are less than three participants, but class entries will be accepted until the end of the prior class. If you wish to request a class that is not listed in the showbill, e-mail [jcrawlson@windstream.net](mailto:jcrawlson@windstream.net) as soon as possible or contact the registration desk at the show.

**Lodging** • Airport Motel is the "official" show motel. A block of rooms has been reserved for Friday and Saturday nights, but please make your reservations well in advance by calling 308-728-3649. Cancellations must be made the day before your arrival. Camper hookups are available at the Fairgrounds.

**Location** • The *show* is located on the *east* edge of Ord, on the north side of Highway 11. The *motel* is located on the *north* edge of Ord on Highway 11.

**Food** • Rolls and coffee will be provided Saturday and Sunday morning at 8:30 a.m. (donations requested). Cans of pop will be available for \$1 each. Our Youth Club will make lunch available on Saturday as a fundraiser to support Youth Club activities. At 6:30 p.m. on Saturday, dinner will be available in conjunction with the Club's Annual Meeting (pay that night). Lunch is on your own on Sunday.
